What citizens vote at Town Meetings generally becomes the rule, including budgets, personnel needs, zoning bylaws, etc. Only at Town Meeting is there a chance to voice your opinion on the issues and to make a difference in how our towns are run.

Our towns are administered by elected Boards of Selectmen with the aid of a paid Town Administrator, elected Planning Boards, Assessors, School Committees, and various other elected and appointed committees. Many citizens take part to make our towns function efficiently and effectively. All must participate for them to function at their best!

TRASH & RECYCLING INFORMATION

The Marion and Mattapoisett Transfer Stations will accept household waste, recyclables, and bulky residential waste, including:

* Comingled recyclables: glass, plastic, tin, aluminum, clean, loose newsprint, cardboard and paper including magazines, computer paper, corrugated cardboard, flat cereal boxes, and junk mail.

* Light metals: bicycles, miscellaneous metals and empty propane tanks. There is a fee for other materials.
